



The quality of driving on our streets has decreased significantly in the past few years.

Perhaps you've seen this, too.
Excessive speeding on 63rd Street,
Austin Ave., Archer Ave., and Cicero
Ave. There is also reckless
abandonment by drivers at stop signs
and red lights. It seems stop signs and
red lights are now optional for some
people. Impatient drivers honk their
horns as soon as the traffic light turns
green. And of course, we've
witnessed or heard about the street
takeovers at intersections that take
place late at night.

Why bring this up in a parish bulletin? Because this aforementioned traffic behavior is but one external symptom of a much deeper issue plaguing our culture. Individualism, selfishness, and impatience are on the rise. This is not good for the common good.

Freedom is confused with license. They are not the same thing. Freedom comes with responsibility and involves words like "could" and "should." License, however, is doing whatever you so desire without concern for individual or societal consequences, and far too many of our fellow citizens think freedom means license to do whatever.

St. John Paul II wrote, "When freedom does not have a purpose, when it does not wish to know

anything about the rule of law engraved in the hearts of men and women, when it does not listen to the voice of conscience, it turns against humanity and society."

Freedom involves responsibility on the part of each citizen.

Viktor Frankl gives us some more food for thought. He wrote, "That is why I recommend that the Statue of Liberty on the East Coast be supplemented by a Statue of Responsibility on the West Coast."

As Christians, we ascent to God's love and God's law; to love and truth, which must go together. Woe to us as human beings when we attempt to separate love and truth, and that is precisely what is happening in our culture today. Truth is on trial as we slide toward total relativism, which insists there is no such thing as objective truth.

This is much bigger than speeding, red lights, and honking. The disregard for authentic freedom and the twisting of right and wrong, good and evil, begins to permeate all corners of our culture; from elected officials to corporate CEOs to media personnel to church leaders. Why is it wrong to run a red light when those who make the laws flaunt the law in other areas of life? Our leaders consciously or unconsciously live the mantra, "Rules for thee but not for me."


This leads the general populace to lose trust in our leaders. We sense that the law only applies to the little guy while those in positions of power can do whatever it is they want to do. This is a crisis of integrity; a crisis of leadership. Wearing a fancy business suit or donning a bishop's miter does not exempt someone obeying God's law, which includes "You shall not murder. You shall not steal. You shall not lie."

Lawlessness is not the route to go for us; not in the streets, not in our homes, not in our businesses, not in our government, not in our churches. We must live our lives mindful of God and mindful of one another as human beings made in the image and likeness of God. This is called reverence. This is called respect. And our man-made laws must be guided by love and truth, which means guided by a Law (God) that is much bigger than any politician, judge, lawyer, or clergyman.

A majority vote can go ahead and declare murder legal. However, making something legal doesn't make it morally right, no matter how much we seek to fool ourselves.

May we as Christians do our part to be personally responsible for our words and actions, and may we be beacons of light for those growing tired of the darkness.

As Catholic Christians, we believe that baptism is the entry point for any person to come into the Church and the family of God. This harkens back to the Great Commission Jesus gave to his disciples shortly before his Ascension: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Baptism was what came before the teachings, the doctrines, and the other aspects of the Christian life. In the creed, then, we "confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins". I'm reminded of this every time I baptize a child, such as my niece Kathryn (picture below).

Regardless of who baptizes a specific believer, if he or she is baptized with water "in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," then that individual is baptized into the community of faith we call the Church. This one baptism unites all followers of Christ, regardless of denominational differences. It is a one-time event that is not repeated and is never revoked. Christ instituted a Church, entered into by baptism, through which the ongoing work of salvation, started at the Incarnation, is carried out.

Baptism has a number of effects for those who receive it:

- Washes away the original sin inherited from our first parents and all other sin
- Becoming a "new creation" as an

adopted child of God, and thus a "partaker of divine nature"

- Becoming a temple of the Holy Spirit
- Incorporating us into the Church
- Seals the Christian with the indelible spiritual mark
- Becoming a priest, prophet, and king

At the time it was established, the action of baptizing was not loaded with the meaning we understand and celebrate today. Prior to Jesus, the Greek word baptizo had the sense of dipping, submerging, or immersing an object. Some had seen John the Baptist practicing it as a penitential act of repentance. That baptism was a gesture of humility before God that invited a new beginning. By being immersed in the water, those who came to John recognized that they had sinned and begged God for purification. It was a literal immersion into water that symbolized regeneration.

The baptismal rite we celebrate today still features water and an immersion, but this immersion brings with it actual regeneration. The life, death, and resurrection of Christ changed the entire concept of baptizing beyond just purification and toward actual union with God. Indeed, a more accurate translation for the command Jesus gives is that the disciples baptize people into the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. There is a sense of movement, not a mere indication of location.

Jesus is asking us to be dynamically immersed into Trinitarian life, into the intimate relationship and love shared by the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This is the renewal that Christ brings - fullness to the concept of baptism as submersion. Through this act with water, God's love is poured out upon them,

cleansing them, and inserting them into the very life and relationships of Jesus. Baptism's cleansing waters destroy what cannot coexist with God's holiness and love. In its place, the Blessed Trinity becomes the new vital principle of life.

So, when we witness a baptism or use holy water, our hearts as believers should be drawn to this full idea of immersion and submersion. We are asked to submerge ourselves into the Trinity again and again, and then live out of that relationship. The initial submersion at baptism is a pivotal event in life. It allows us to return over and over to God the Father with Jesus his Savior in the power of the Holy Spirit.

It's an event that deserves remembrance. I encourage everyone to celebrate their baptism every year as you would a birthday. When you celebrate, be reminded of what baptism means and what is given to us. We are tapped into the source. Through the baptismal entry door, we are empowered to stay close to the Church and her sacraments that will help us all live this life submerged in self-giving Trinitarian love. From that font, we grow and mature in our faith to bear fruits of holiness.



The W's and How's of SPRED...

WHAT is SPRED?

SPRED (Special Religious Development) is a program which trains and guides parishes to provide faith formation to persons with developmental disabilities and/or learning problems and become integrated into parish life.

WHO is served by SPRED?

SPRED serves children and adults with various developmental and cognitive disabilities such as Down's Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy, anyone in the Autism Spectrum, seizure disorders, learning disabilities, etc. Participation starts at the age of 6 and may continue throughout adulthood.

HOW can faith be nourished in those with developmental disabilities?

A relationship with God is accessible to all. Friendship is the human experience closest to understanding the presence of God in life. By calling to mind life experiences, sharing these experiences in a circle of friendship, the small community of faith becomes aware of the sacredness of all life and then returns to life changed.

WHY SPRED?

In SPRED, each person is partnered with a catechist, a model of faith and friendship. As trust is established and friendship deepens, we all become aware of our place in the family of God and celebrate it in our community of faith that extends to the greater parish community.

WILL my son or daughter or the person in my care participate liturgically and sacramentally in the church? Sacraments and liturgy are a right of all people and are accessible to all. Participation in a SPRED community helps to facilitate readiness to enjoy the Sacraments with reverence and a new awareness.

HOW can I or my child participate in the SPRED program?




