FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG

Last Sunday our parish welcomed Chicago auxiliary Bishop Mark Bartosic as we celebrated two Confirmation Masses for a total of 74 young disciples who are now fully initiated into the Church.

There was a special moment seen by only a few people when the bishop anointed with sacred Chrism the forehead of one of the children. The child's adult sponsor was overcome with emotion; her eyes welling up with happy tears as she wore a joyous smile. The moment caught me by surprise and moved me, too.

These are precious moments. The Holy Spirit was at work; certainly, for the entire Confirmation Mass but in a particular way in the life of that sponsor. My hunch is she knew the power of the moment as she stood there with her hand on the child's shoulder as the child received the fullness of the Holy Spirit.

This is the same Holy Spirit that hovered over the waters of creation. The same Holy Spirit involved in Mary becoming pregnant with Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah. The same Holy Spirit present to the first disciples on the day of Pentecost. The same Holy Spirit you received at Baptism and Confirmation. The same Holy Spirit who turns at Holy Mass ordinary bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ in the gift of the Eucharist.

There are times that I, as a priest of Jesus Christ, need to be careful when I

am speaking the words of the Eucharistic Prayer during Holy Mass. If I am not careful, I can get too emotional when I realize what is taking place, and I, an unworthy servant, speak the words of Jesus Christ. "Take this all of you and eat of it. This is my Body given up for you." My human but ordained human hands holding our Eucharistic Lord for all to see.

Dear friends, we need the Holy Spirit. We always have, and we certainly need the Holy Spirit today. Woe to us when we forget the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives, in our families, in our parishes, in our Church.

This reminds me of the quote by Christian evangelist Reinhard Bonnke, who said, "The less Holy Spirit we have, the more cake and coffee we need to keep the Church going."

Lives are not transformed by cake and coffee. They might transform our waistline but not our hearts. The transformation of minds and hearts is the work of the Holy Spirit. All the great works of beauty in music, literature, and art that move souls toward God involved the work of the Holy Spirit.

Think of Franz Schubert composing his version of Ave Maria. Yes, he had great skill and talent, but for a masterpiece like Ave Maria to come forth in time and space, he needed a little special help. Just the first few notes played on the piano or organ is enough to water my eyes. Thank you, Franz Schubert. Thank you, Holy Spirit. You get the picture.

Now, as we make our way through Lent and through this life on earth, we must be aware that another spirit is at play in our world. This is the dark spirit of the Adversary and his demonic minions. Some folks scoff at any mention of evil, but Jesus didn't scoff. The reality of sin, evil, and death is the reason Christ came into this world; to eternally conquer it, and he has done just that by

way of his Paschal Mystery (suffering, death, resurrection and ascension).

Although eternally conquered, the Adversary is allowed its time. This loveless spirit cannot create anything of goodness, truth or beauty, so instead, it seeks to destroy; to tear apart, to chip away at what is good, what is true and what is beautiful.

The good Lord has given us everything we need to protect ourselves and to enable us to have a life of grace. But we must USE the gifts given to us by God; gifts that come to us in and through his Church. A construction worker doesn't just think about his tools or merely look at his tools. He puts the tools of the trade to use to build a new house.

We, too, must regularly pray, make use of the sacraments, read and ponder sacred scripture, make use of sacramentals such as holy water, and perform the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

And let's remember the gifts of the Holy Spirit we received the day of our Confirmation: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. These are wonderful gifts we use as we discern what is of the Holy Spirit and what is of the spirit that works against God.

Thank you, Lord! Thank you!

Quote - "God the Father has marked you with his sign; Christ the Lord has confirmed you and has placed his pledge, the Spirit, in your hearts."

Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi. Some prophets don't have their own books, like Elijah and Elisha (found in 1 Kings) or Nathan (found in 2 Samuel). In Hebrew, these men were called the Nevi'im.

OT prophecy has a large variety of messages; some are hopeful and consoling, some are words of doom and destruction, and some are images that, like the parables, can leave you scratching your head. Regardless of the message, the prophets meant to spur the people to action and to grow in trust in the Lord through conversion.

For us as Christians, we can see the Spirit working through the prophets to not only bring people back to the Lord in their own day, but in preparing for the coming of Christ. We hear in Eucharistic Prayer IV, "Time and again you [Father] offered them covenants and through the prophets taught them to look forward to salvation." Jesus himself quoted the prophets, especially Isaiah, in his teaching of the Kingdom of God. He knew the hearts of the people had been readied for his saving presence and actions.

At baptism, we are anointed as priests, prophets, and kings as we are brought into the Church and the family of God. This doesn't mean that we need to set ourselves completely apart from society and be ostracized, but it does mean we

are called to witness to the truth of our faith and God's word. Remember, a prophet's first job was to share God's word and explain to the people what God wanted them to do.

A person is a prophet in the measure that he or she bears the truth of God. Now, in a world like ours that has lost its bearings, those who speak the divine truth may appear unhinged or countercultural. In bearing God's truth, we are on for allowing our hearts, minds, and souls for continued enrichment by the Holy Spirit. We can exercise our brains by studying philosophy, theology, spirituality, Church history, and the lives of the saints. We can build our spiritual strength in prayer and the sacraments. Then, having been illumined, we as prophets are sent out into our ordinary lives as beacons of light.

This can look like going out of your way to assist someone who is struggling, even if it is in a small way. Sometimes the only Truth a person needs preached is the basis of the Gospel: that they are loved and valuable. It can look like instructing the young in goodness, truth, and beauty in an intentional way. It can look like telling your family why you are a disciple, sharing your faith story and opening an invitation to them to see for themselves.

The last thing we attribute to the Holy Spirit in the creed is that he is the one "who has spoken through the prophets". On this side of Jesus Christ, his Resurrection, and the descent of the Spirit at Pentecost, the power of the Holy Spirit is available all those who are baptized, which is then amplified at confirmation. However, this does not mean that the Spirit of God was not at work prior to the Incarnation.

God the Father sent several representatives, empowered by his very spirit, to speak to his people on his behalf. Often, it would be in response to a crisis of faith, a loss of identity, or general misguided behavior by the Israelites. These are the prophets, sent to speak truth and reveal God and his will.

When we think of prophecy, we might just think of predictions of the future or a telling of what is to come. While that can be part of it, true prophecy is preaching something that comes from God in a way that the receiver can understand. Through human nature, the Word of God is translated into a person for a particular time and place. This prophet is called in some way by God to go in his place and speak the words that need to be said, even if it will be difficult to receive.

In the Old Testament, there are a number of prophetic books, which we divide into major and minor prophets. This division isn't so much about importance, but in the length of their writings. The four major prophets are Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel. The twelve minor prophets are Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah,

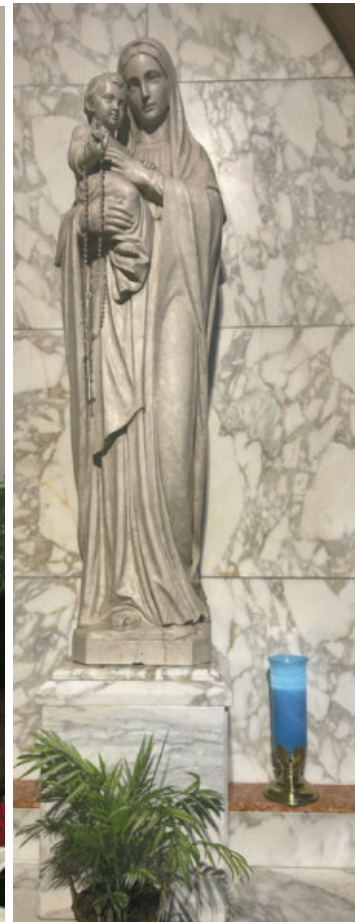

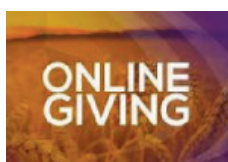

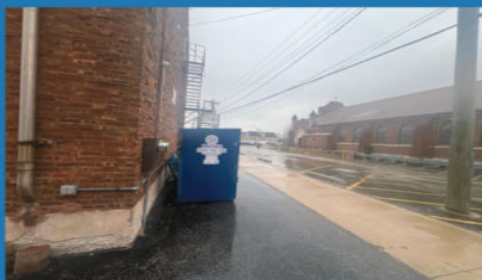
