This Sunday we celebrate the beginning of Catholic schools' week.

Few things are more important than the formation and education of our children. Certainly, this begins in the home, but our Catholic schools have an obligation to make sure our children are learning the academic basics, but also that they are being formed in faith.

The faculty and staff of our parish school (St. Symphorosa School) understand the mission. At our school, we believe that all things are possible with God, a community of kindness, love and support equals success, and our children are stewards of God's gift.

The education and formation of our children is so much more than learning facts and figures so that we can take exams. The ancient philosopher Aristotle expressed it well when he wrote, "Education of the mind without education of the heart is no education at all."

This basically means that the mind and the heart should work together. We want to illuminate the minds of our children, but we also want to enlarge their hearts so that love guides their life choices.

In our Catholic schools, we teach through the lens of Christian anthropology. This means our children learn who they are as human beings. They are not the product of random chance. They are not cosmic accidents. Instead, they learn that we are made in the image and likeness of God; capable of knowing and loving. We are body and soul, and just as it's important to take care of the body, we must also care for the soul.

Do we want our children to get a good academic education? Yes. Do we want them to be able to go to the high school/college of their choice? Yes. Do we want them to have a good career? Yes. But more importantly, we want them to be life-long disciples of Christ and to be saints who will live forever in God's love.

We refute the secular atheistic notion that to be people of faith, we have to shut off our brain. That's nonsense! We subscribe to the truth that faith and reason go together in the quest for goodness, beauty, and truth.

We want our children to use in the real world what they have learned in their schooling, but we also want them to live for the greater glory of God and the building of God's kingdom on earth. This is what gives purpose and meaning to life; and this is what guards against us becoming robots of industry in a dehumanizing production/consumption system.

As the pastor of Two Holy Martyrs Parish, I invite all of us to be ambassadors of our parish grade school. Please support our school, even if it's merely telling a young family looking for a school to come and give us a look. We also encourage contributions to the Fr. Norm Trela Tuition Assistance Fund, which provides financial help for needy families to attend our school. We also invite you to pray for our principal, teachers, staff, and school families. Prayer is always a good thing.

There is no doubt that sending our children to a Catholic school is a sacrifice. As it stands today, there is no voucher system or tax credit system to help school families alleviate tuition cost of a private school. So, in addition to paying taxes that fund our public school system, our Catholic school families pay a private school tuition. This can be tough for some families, but they make the sacrifice because it's important to them.

So, as we celebrate Catholic Schools week throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago, may we all be grateful for the gift of our children and our children's children. May we also be grateful for the men and women who lead and teach in our Catholic schools. Peace!

We started off our exploration of the Nicene Creed by seeing that the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople were called in order address heresies that were attacking the person of Jesus Christ and who he was. As clarifications were made, new heresies popped up due to misunderstandings, which then required further clarifications.

It's important to recognize what heresy is. We'll often use the word to respond to someone speaking wrongly about the Catholic faith, whether it is doctrine, morality, or worship, even if it's accidental. However, this is too broad. True heresy is when someone is publicly professing something they know to be against the Church, being told they are wrong, and then persisting in that wrong teaching.

For example, Arius wasn't teaching that the Son was less than the Father out of ignorance or misspeaking. He believed he was correct and did not recant when the Church told him he was wrong. If you or I say something false and are corrected, we aren't formal heretics if we admit the mistake and continue on with the right belief. Many times, it's out of being improperly instructed or confusing a teaching. The important thing is the asking of questions and being open to be informed by the Church, which passes on the truth of the faith left by Jesus.

FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

Arianism was not the only heresy the Church dealt with as she clarified who Jesus or the Trinity was. We learned earlier about Apollinarianism, which taught that the divine mind replaced the human mind in Jesus. Usually, the heresy overstressed either the humanity or the divinity of Christ instead of holding the truth that he is both true God and true man. Here are some others that popped up in the early Church:

- Docetism: Jesus didn't have an actual body but only appeared to be human to our eyes. Docetists believed that matter was evil, and that God would never take a physical body for himself.
- Adoptionism: Jesus was not the true Son of God, but a great man chosen by God to act as his son.
 Rather than being divine by nature, Jesus was merely adopted as divine at his baptism or made so by the resurrection.
- Monophysitism: Jesus didn't have two natures, but the divine and human natures combined to form a new type of incarnate nature. It stems from a belief that the divine nature would have entirely swallowed up human nature.
- Nestorianism: Christ had a divine and human nature, but they weren't truly united. The Word of God merely dwelt in the human body as a sort of passenger. Nestorians would not refer to Mary as the mother of God (Theotokos) but rather the mother of Christ the human person, who was later united to the divine person.
- Monothelitism: Jesus didn't have two wills, but just a divine will that controls and overtakes the human will.
- Modalism: The Trinity isn't three persons, but instead three modes

- or instances of being God, much like water can be found in three states (ice, water, vapor),
- Tritheism: There is not one God but three co-equal Gods, distinct and not united.
- Partialism: The persons of the Trinity combine to form one God.

You'll see a number of these heresies pop up from time to time. Whether online or in passing, I'll hear Mary being denied as the mother of God or the Trinity compared to a shamrock that makes up the entire leaf. Usually, these are just a matter of misunderstanding that just needs to be cleared up.

There are other heresies that the Church has fought, and continues to fight, that aren't directly related to the Trinity or Jesus Christ, such as Pelagianism, modernism, or Donatism. These may be subjects of future columns. What's key in battling against heresy is that we stay united to the heart of the Church and don't try to take the easy way out of following God. Heretics usually stay that way in order to avoid dealing with the full truth about who God is. We remain steadfast in the Church because she was given to us by Christ.




