Every year, the Catholic Church in the United States of America recognizes October as Respect Life month.

Human life is sacred, for it is God-given. Not a single one of us created ourselves. We have been loved into existence by Love (The Holy Trinity), and we are sustained in existence at very moment because God wills it.

We know that one day our earthly body will expire. We remember, however, that as human beings we are more than a physical body. We are body and soul; an embodied soul, to be more precise, and the soul is immortal. The soul lives on.

As Christians, we believe that one day, when all is brought to fulfillment at the end of time, the immortal soul is joined with our glorified body in a new heaven and new earth. This is why we do not despair death. Yes, we might grieve the loss of a loved one, or grieve our own inevitable death, but we are people of hope because of the promise of Christ, and our faith in Him as our Savior and Redeemer.

Our prayer is that all human life be respected at all stages from the moment of conception through natural death. Yes, this includes the unborn, but it also includes those of advanced age who risk being seen as expendable, or worse, seen as an inconvenience. We also include respect for human life at all the in-between stages, and this taps into the basic material human needs of food, shelter, and clothing.

When we recognize the sacredness in

our fellow human beings, we are more inclined to treat one another with dignity and respect. However, when we no longer see human life as sacred, when the Creator is denied, we risk slipping toward dehumanization.

Aldous Huxley, the author of *Brave New World*, wrote, "The purpose of propaganda is to make one set of people forget that other sets of people are human."

He's correct, and once we see the other as "less than human," it becomes easier on the conscience to "delete" them, for whatever reason we deem the "deletion" necessary. History is replete with Us versus Them battles, conflicts and wars. Humans killing humans.

Jesus helps us see our common origin and our common humanity. In the unity of our Lord, we can celebrate our diversity. However, when we lose sight of what we ALL have in common, we are left only with how we are different, and we cite those differences to the exclusion of the one human race. Jesus shed blood for all of humanity, not just "those people."

Respecting human life begins by respecting God, respecting that God became human (Incarnation), respecting that YOU are God's creation, and by the sacrament of Baptism we are God's children by adoption, thanks be to Jesus, the Christ.

We don't need more man-made laws to make this clear. We need to rediscover God's law; you shall not murder, and that, my friends, is a matter of the heart.


We intend to have our parish school families using FORMED, as well as our Faith Formation families. However, everyone can use FORMED.

mystery that had been revealed by Christ, he wanted to take the easy way out in just denying an aspect of revealed truth.

Several Church Fathers, like Basil, Gregory of Nazianzus, and Ambrose saw the danger in Apollinarius' teaching. They knew that, per scripture, Jesus grew in age, wisdom, and grace, that he experienced temptation, and that he suffered. Additionally, they helped to make known the "soteriological principle": what is not assumed is not redeemed. Soteriology is the study of Christ's salvific actions. The principle establishes that if Jesus did not take on certain aspects of humanity, then those aspects would not have been present in him on the cross and would therefore remain unsaved and unhealed. It was especially important that the mind was healed because it had been the source of the Fall of Adam and Eve. These Fathers taught that Jesus took on complete human nature at moment of the Incarnation.

Also at this time, a group formed called the Pneumatomachians (say that five times fast). The name means "Battlers against the Spirit", which fit because they were fighting against the divinity of the Holy Spirit, which was also known as the Macedonian heresy. Emperor Theodosius had just made Christianity the official religion of Rome. Wanting to avoid new divisions from threatening both the Church and the empire, he called for another large council of bishops in 381 AD along with Pope Damasus I. This time, it was held in Constantinople, the new capital of the Roman Empire.

Like Nicaea I, the first steps of the council were to declare the teachings of both Apollinarius and the Pneumatomachians as anathema (that is, as wrong and heretical doctrine). From there, they added to the creed formed at Nicaea to clarify further who Jesus was fully God and fully man with a rational human soul and to affirm that the Holy Spirit, like the Son, is fully God. It also added some language from the Apostle's Creed about the involvement of Mary and Pontius Pilate and the role of the Church and baptism.

The primary result of Constantinople I was the creed, written in Greek, that we still use today and recite at Mass. While more councils would be needed to provide the necessary clarifications on the Son and the Holy Spirit (seven in total), this creed from Nicaea and Constantinople remained the same and provided a basis on which further doctrines and dogmas could be defined. Now that we have the background for our creed, we can more deeply explore the beliefs we express so clearly and confidently every Sunday.

As we learned last week, the First Council of Nicaea was massively instrumental in clarifying who Jesus was. It provided an initial statement of beliefs that could be used by bishops and the faithful to promote correct faith. However, some questions remained following the rejection of Arius and his teaching that Jesus Christ was not divine, but merely the highpoint of creation. Namely, there arose confusion about how Jesus was both fully human and fully divine.

In an effort to distance himself from Arius, the bishop Apollinarius began to teach that the divine mind and soul of Jesus completely overwhelmed his human mind. Not only was Jesus divine, he couldn't have a full human nature because it couldn't coexist with the fullness of that divinity. With the highest functions of the human mind, intellect and will, replaced by the divine intellect and will, Jesus merely took on the material aspects of human nature.

Again, it's not that Apollinarius wanted to destroy Christianity from within. Like Arius, he refused to hold in tension and wrestle with the concept of a person who had both human and divine natures. Instead of embracing and diving into the

The focus of these Parent Gatherings will be to honor your role as parents and assist you in that role.


