

This coming week we celebrate the feast day of one of our two holy martyrs.

The Catholic Church recognizes July 18 as the memorial of St. Symphorosa and her Seven Sons. The story of this martyrdom dates back to the first century AD.

What is a martyr? Basically, a martyr is a witness to the faith. In its extreme, the word martyr means someone who was put to death on account of their faith; because of the name of Jesus Christ. This is known as red martyrdom.

There is also white martyrdom. A person suffers in some way because of the faith, but they were not killed. Examples include losing a job because of the faith, not getting a promotion because you're a Christian, or enduring mockery and ridicule in a public way because of the name of Jesus.

We'd like to think that martyrdom is a thing of the past, but sadly, it's as common today as if was in the first three hundred years of Christianity. Some would argue that the killing of people because they are Christian is on the rise is certain parts of the world.

The martyrs are also inspirations for us. They help us stay strong and courageous as we witness to the faith in the here and now. It's easy to just go with the flow when it comes to cultural trends; trends that often fly in opposition Christ and to Church teaching.

So, this week, we hold up St.
Symphorosa and Her Seven Sons as one of our patron saints. St. Rene Goupil and the North American Martyrs are honored in October. These two saints and their respective stories serve as the supporting columns of Two Holy Martyrs Parish.

Priest Convocation

A few weeks ago, many (305) of the priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago gathered in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin for our biannual Convocation.

For three and a half days, we gathered as brothers in Christ to pray, ponder, rest, and recreate. Very rarely do we as a presbyterate gather in such numbers. We got to see one another, talk to one another, and share with one another.

Our Convocation theme was "One in Christ." As we navigate the continued renewal in the Archdiocese of Chicago, it's important that our priests share a collective gaze upon the Lord. We are a very diverse presbyterate but the bond we share is our love for Jesus.

Please pray for the priests of this Archdiocese, but also for all priests throughout the world. Once a man is ordained a priest, he becomes a instrument of God's grace in the world, but he also becomes a target for the diabolic. Priests on the frontlines need our support and our prayers. It's a joyous life but it's also a life that shares in the cross of Christ.

Please also pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. God has not stopped calling people. He still calls men to the priesthood, and he still calls men and women to religious life. Sadly, the culture is noisy, so it's tough to hear the call, but the culture also discourages such vocational commitments. We can do our part to encourage vocations and nurture vocations.

Eucharistic Congress

This week, keep an eye on Indianapolis, Indiana.

Lucas Oil Stadium becomes center stage for the first national Eucharistic Congress in 83 years. Tens of thousands of people will converge in the Hoosier state to help remind themselves and others of the wonderful gift of the Eucharist.

The Eucharistic Congress will run from July 17 through July 21. There is a calendar of events that will help people grow closer to Christ and grow closer to each other.

I don't know how much news coverage this event will get in the mainstream news outlets, but we pray that the Holy Spirit moves hearts and illumines minds during this sacred time as the good news of salvation is shared and lived.

We do not worship a piece of bread. We worship Christ; the Son of God and Son of man who makes Himself intimately available to us in the Eucharist. What wonderous love!

FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

As we move through the liturgical calendar, we can all mark the changing of the church seasons by the color vestments the priest wears at Mass. These colors are meant to be instantly recognizable; one knows the season just by those colors. This can help set the minds and hearts of the faithful to focus on something specific associated to the season at a given Mass. This is all a part of the great symbolism of the Mass, where something visible and sensible helps us move beyond to the invisible reality it represents.

There are four primary liturgical colors and three others that are allowed by the rubrics. These primary shades are white, green, purple, and red, while the other colors are rose/pink, black, and gold.

When the priest wears white, we are celebrating the purity, light, glory, and joy of God. So, it's appropriate that these colors are for Christmas and Easter, the two highest feast days of the Church's year. White is then used throughout those seasons to symbolize the lasting joy that these great solemnities bring. Feast days of the Lord, such as Corpus Christi, Holy Thursday, or the Transfiguration. White is also used for weddings and funerals, as well as the feast days for Mary and saints that were not martyred.

Green is the color of Ordinary Time, so it becomes very familiar though the summer and autumn months. This color represents growth, life, and hope. It's good to remember that "Ordinary" time is not called that because it is the boring, common passing period between Easter and Christmas. Rather, it is the "ordinal", or positional, numbers, like first or twenty-seventh, that we use to mark the given week of the season.

Purple is used in Advent and Lent. As the color of royalty, it is also the color of penance, sacrifice, and preparation. Jesus was clothing in a purple cloak during his trial as a form of mockery. So, while purple can symbolize the pain and suffering of sin and death that brought Jesus to the cross, it also looks forward it reminds us of Jesus' resurrection and hope of newness reveals him as our king. It's in these seasons that rose is allowed, either on Gaudete Sunday (3rd week of Advent) or Laetare Sunday (4th week of Lent). This color marks that the season is more than halfway over, so we can celebrate with some joy that the great feasts are coming close.

Red is the color of the Holy Spirit, fire, and blood, so we use it on Pentecost, for confirmations, Good Friday, and for any feast day of a martyr. One can imagine the passionate fire of God's love burning for all of us as we see the red vestments and are lit on fire within like the Apostles in the Upper Room.

Black vestments were historically worn for funerals and for requiem Masses for the dead. While black is certainly a color symbolizing death and mourning, it also is a reminder of the need of God's mercy and the reality of the judgment we all will

face upon our death. Black is still allowed today for funerals and All Souls Day. Often, black vestments are interlaced with silver or gold, which reminds us that with death comes the resurrection. Here at THM, our funeral vestments combine white and black to unite baptism, death, and new life that is being remembered at the Mass.

Gold is allowed for any solemnity in which white is worn. As a precious color, gold enhances the beauty and nobility of the great feasts of the Church. In the same way people bring out their nicest suits and dresses for important occasions, wearing gold really emphasis the greatness of what is being celebrated.

Finally, a brief note on the color blue. Blue has long been associated with the Blessed Virgin Mary, but blue vestments are not an option in the Roman Rite. However, white and gold vestments can be adorned with blue and Marian decals in honor of Mary.
