FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG



One of the definitions of the word consumerism is "the preoccupation of society with the acquisition of consumer goods."

Notice the word

"preoccupation." Part of life is the necessity of obtaining certain goods for basic human needs. The danger, however, is when the totality of life becomes solely about producing goods and obtaining goods. And if you do not produce or consume, you have no value to society.

Woe to a culture that views the human person as a mere cog in the production/ consumption wheel. We, as human beings, are not cogs, not robots, not automatons. We are flesh and blood. We are embodied souls. We have an inherent human dignity because we are created in the image and likeness of God. When we lose sight of our human dignity, watch out!

All through October, we, the Church, continue to recognize Respect Life month. Of course, this is something we are called to do 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year, but we set aside one month to remind ourselves not only who we are, but WHOSE we are. We bear the image of the divine, and this is to be respected.

Our main pre-occupation in the Church is Jesus, the Lord. Christ gives us all we need for our salvation. We have Sacred Scripture. We have the sacraments, especially the gift of the Eucharist.

We have prayer. We have the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. When we center our life on the Lord, we then become attentive to the needs of our neighbors in need. This is how it is all connected. Love God and love neighbor.

We must caution against turning our faith into another consumer item. Who

among us hasn't heard a fellow brother or sister say, "I don't get anything out of Mass." Our parish staff will sometimes hear an inquiring parent say, "My child needs to get baptism." And then we do not see the family again until First Communion. These are the ways we risk being mere consumers of the faith instead of becoming disciples; of entering relationship with Christ and with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Jesus helps us, by way of grace, to place our GIVE before our GET. We approach the altar of the Lord, mindful that we are surrendering our hearts to Him. We bring our joys and sorrows and place them on the altar. We say thank you to the One who then gives us His Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist. We are sent back into the ordinariness of the world as instruments of God's love. We go forth saying, "How may I serve?"

A little baby, an elderly person, or a disabled person might be of zero value in the ever-moving production line of consumer society. Consume, produce, or be gone. We, as disciples of Christ, do not see it that way. We see a fellow human being who has been loved into existence, sustained by God's love every single day and summoned to spend eternity in Love's presence.

Imagine a cold, heartless, bureaucratic bean-counter viewing you as no longer of value, to the point you can be "deleted." Now imagine a God who so loves the world that He gave His only Son so that everyone who believes in Him may not be lost but may have eternal life.

In God's eyes, YOU matter. And so does every single human life.

FR. MATT'S REFLECTION



A series of common positions, which you might have heard, are the following: "Why should I bother worshipping God? Doesn't He already know everything

about me? I haven't murdered anyone, and I am a good person. Why does God need my worship?" Another series of questions, which you also might have heard, includes, "Can't I just worship God on my own? Why do I have to go to a church? Isn't God with me everywhere?" The readings for this Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time answer these views by revealing how, by our dispositions or attitudes, we respond to God through divine worship and why we offer it.

In the abbreviated story about Naaman the Syrian, who is miraculously cured of leprosy after heeding St. Elisha the Prophet's instructions, we hear of Naaman acting with an attitude of gratitude: "Naaman returned with his whole retinue to the man of God. On his arrival, he stood before Elisha and said, 'Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel. Please accept a gift from your servant." (2 Kings 5:15) Naaman is humbled by the cure, which neither he nor anyone else could accomplish for him, and now cleansed, is overwhelmingly

thankful. Naaman then professes, "'[Please] let me, your servant, have two mule-loads of earth, for I will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except to the LORD.'" (2 Kings 5:17) After he has is blessed a seemingly impossible gift of restored health, he is not quick to forget or deny the source of his cure: God. Thus, Naaman is converted to faith in the God of Israel and is now humbly disposed to worship the Lord, who has accomplished such a good work, to continue his thanksgiving and praise of God.

St. Elisha the Prophet also continues in thanksgiving and praise of God by his response to Naaman's initial offer of a gift, directing all of the gratitude be offered to God, not the Prophet himself. This too is an act of humility. St. Elisha knows that God is the source of Naaman's cure and that claiming credit for the miracle would risk pride and a turning away from God. Persevering in humility before God is fostered by divine worship, which St. Elisha continues and Naaman declares he will begin to practice.

A similar sequence of events is reported in the Gospel Reading. In this instance, ten people with leprosy "raised their voices, saying, 'Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!' And when he saw them, he said, 'Go show yourselves to the priests.' As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan." (Luke 17:13-16) As with Naaman, God has miraculously cured these ten individuals, accomplishing a good work beyond their God-given abilities. In contrast to Naaman, though, only one of the ten responds with gratitude and praise for God.

It is possible that the other nine followed Jesus' instruction literally and have gone to show themselves to the priests, which was the normal method for how a person cured of leprosy would be declared clean and able to rejoin the community. However, Jesus seems to perceive a difference in the attitude and response of the other nine individuals: "Jesus said in reply, 'Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?' Then he said to him, 'Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." (Luke 17:17-19) What is also notable in Jesus' assessment is that He does not ask, "'Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to [me]?'" despite being the Son of God who actually cures the ten people but also directs the thanksgiving and praise to God the Father.

From the examples of Naaman, St. Elisha the Prophet, the Samaritan and Jesus, what do their attitudes and dispositions reveal about the worship of God? How does our participation in the Mass form our dispositions and influence our divine worship and our daily response to God?

AN EASY TO USE GUIDE ON HOW TO PRAY Ever try to pray only to soon find out you don't know what to do? Ever visit a Holy Hour in front of the Monstrance and

become frustrated because you didn't know what to do? Here are a few suggestions as to how to make a good holy hour.

MINUTES 0-5: Meditate on the following quote from the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "God calls man first. Man may forget his Creator or hide far from his face; he may run after idols or accuse the deity of having abandoned him; yet the living and true God tirelessly calls each person to that mysterious encounter known as prayer. In prayer, God's initiative of love always comes first; our own first step is always a response." (no. 2567)

MINUTES 5-10: Look in your heart; look at your life. What do you want? What do you really want from God? Tell God right now what you need from Him during this time of prayer.

MINUTES 10-15: Find a passage from the Bible. Maybe it's a Psalm; maybe it's the readings from daily Mass; maybe it's the readings at the upcoming Sunday Mass. Find a passage from Scripture. Read the passage slowly. Get familiar with the text. Read the passage a second time, this time read it even slower. Very, very slowly read the passage a third time. Pay attention to which word, words, or phrases "tug" at your heart or get your attention.

MINUTES 15-25: Think about your life; think about the reality of your life. What are the word, words, or phrases from the Bible speaking to in your life? How does the Bible passage connect to your life? Look deep within.

MINUTES 25-35: Talk to God. Talk to God as if He were a real person. Talk to God like Moses did: "The Lord used to speak to Moses face to face, as one man speaks to another." (Exodus 33:11)

MINUTES 35-45: Listen. God will speak to you. Maybe God will speak to you through a thought in your head ... or a song in your heart or a memory ... or a feeling in your body. Listen with all your senses.

MINUTES 45-50: Return to the Scripture passage again. Read it slowly one more time. Is there any word, words, or phrases that speak to you again?

MINUTES 50-55: What can you do today, this week, to act on what God has revealed to you? Practically speaking, in your real life, what can you do?

MINUTES 55-60: Thank the Lord. Blessings are specific and so should our gratitude. Tell God specifically what you're thankful for.

One hour with Christ could change your life!
