FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG

This weekend we recognize one of our two holy martyrs as we celebrate the memorial of St. Rene Goupil and the North American Martyrs.

Over five years ago, as we engaged in the Renew My Church process, one of the items that needed to be discussed and decided upon was the new parish name. We solicited name options from the people of the parish, and many wonderful name options were submitted.

Parish leadership eventually decided upon Two Holy Martyrs Parish. This name choice allows us to combine the martyrs St. Symphorosa and St. Rene Goupil under a united one-name umbrella. The final name decision was approved by the Archbishop of Chicago and his advisory team, but they initially pushed back a little bit on our name submission.

However, we explained our reasoning. There was going to be a new name regardless. One option was to go with an entirely new name, as many new parishes have in other parts of the archdiocese. We could have become St. Benezet Parish, or Blessed Fulton Sheen Parish, or Blessed Carlo Acutis Parish, or St. Theresa of Calcutta Parish.

Instead, our thinking was that the name Two Holy Martyrs gives us a new name to unite around all the while maintaining the names that have been so familiar to people in the Clearing and Garfield Ridge neighborhoods for decades.

A slogan we've used the past five years has been, "Honor the past. Live in the present. Prepare for the future."

This inspires us to be present to the realities of 2024 and the next 50

years as we proclaim the good news of salvation on the southwest side of Chicago all the while we remember the blood, sweat and tears of people who helped the original two parishes get off the ground.

Our two martyrs gave their lives for the Holy Name of Jesus. Their witness to the faith should inspire us and give us courage to live our faith despite obstacles and opposition. It's easy to be a Christian when life is all roses, but we are encouraged by the story of St. Symphorosa and Her Seven Sons and the story of St. Rene Goupil and the North American martyrs to accept the thorns when they come our way.

Every saint, including our two holy martyrs, would give this spiritual advice to us today: Look to Jesus first. Seek first the kingdom of God, and everything else then finds its proper place in relation to God. Happy Feast Day, St. Rene Goupil (October 19).

Expressing Gratitude

Allow me to return to the theme of gratitude once again.

Thank you to so many folks who regularly volunteer for various things around our two-campus parish; from ushers, to lectors, to choir members, to extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, to the various groups and group leaders. Things don't just happen by wishing them to happen. These volunteers help make parish life possible.

In a special way this week, I'd like to recognize all those people who helped make our recent Rummage Sale possible, and all those who helped make our Pasta Night fundraiser a reality. A combination of parishioners and parish staff worked together to make these events a reality. This is a blessing. We are all grateful.

Allow me to also publicly thank members of our parish staff who volunteered their weekend time to help at the Rummage Sale. Thank you for donating your time and effort for the people of the parish and this community.

Cell Phone Reminder

Every so often it's good to remind ourselves before we enter one of our two churches for Holy Mass to silence or shut off our cell phones, or any other device that makes noise.

Let's face it, cell phones (and other electronic devices) are our new reality, but all our devices are equipped with ways to silence them or shut them off when necessary.

We all forget at times. I know I do. But we're all responsible for respecting the dignity of sacred liturgy, and Holy Mass is not the place for our dings, rings, and things. Holy Mass is our time of communal prayer and song.

This is a matter of respect for God, for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and for one another.

Lest we think priests are not susceptible, I remember being at St. Alexander in Palos Heights prior to entering the seminary. During a weekend Mass, in a moment of complete silence, a cell phone rang, and the ringer was the Notre Dame Fight Song. And it was LOUD. People looked around to see whose it was. Sure enough, it was Fr. Guilty sitting in the presider's chair. The people forgave him, the Gipper forgave him, and so did Notre Dame (Our Lady).

phenomenon. They would have human tendencies and divine powers. Sometimes they would interact with humanity, but only when it was advantageous to them. Societies set up different temples to the different gods. Typically, gods would have loyalties to a specific society.

Early Christians were thought to be polytheists due to their belief in the Trinity. We know that this is not true, as the Trinity is three divine persons united in one Godhead, all sharing the same divine substance (again, the topic of a future article). God is non-competitive; the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit share one nature and one mission. Also, while they are honored and venerated, neither Mary nor the saints are divine.

A belief in one God who created everything and rules over everything is a foundational belief in the Jewish religion. The central prayer in Judaism is the "Shema". It comes directly from Deuteronomy 6:4 stating, "Hear, O Israel, the Lord, our God, is one." From this arises the entire law given to Moses by the Lord. Not only is it a statement of monotheism, but it reveals that God is a single, unified whole. Any attempt to describe God in attributes or pieces is due to our limited human understanding. For example, God is not powerful, but he is power itself. He is not loving, but he is love itself. He is not a being, but is being and existence itself.

It is from the Hebrew tradition that Christianity arises. Any attempts to separate the two results in an attempt to divide God, which is fruitless. There was an early Church theologian named Marcion who

tried to argue that the God of the Old Testament was different from the God of the New Testament. He saw the Old Testament God as wrathful, inconsistent, jealous, and a bad creator, while the New Testament God was one of love and mercy.

While the wrath of God can be seen in some Old Testament stories, that doesn't mean he is some different God; he does not change. The Old Testament has far more instances of God's mercy, compassion, and desire to be with his people. He didn't do some divine rebranding when he came to Earth at the Incarnation.

Stating our belief in one God is an essential place to start. "Oneness" is an attribute of being God; If God is not one, he is not God. As the Catechism puts so clearly, "Faith in God leads us to turn to him alone as our first origin and our ultimate goal, and neither to prefer anything to him nor to substitute anything for him." If there were a multitude of gods, we'd be kept guessing. Rather, we have one God we know we can turn to and trust, and then come to know him and be united to him with the rest of the communion of saints.



The first article in our statement of belief is that there is one God. This primarily builds off the long-standing beliefs going back to the moment of creation. By affirming that there is one God, we make three assertions. First, that God exists. Second, that there is only one God, which rejects polytheism. Third, that the one God acclaimed here is the same God of the Hebrew Scriptures.

The rise in atheism is a relatively modern phenomenon. During and after the Enlightenment period, it became more common to state that there was no God, or that God was just the name that we gave human progress, or that God was a projection of our inner selves. Theologians have given various "proofs" for God's existence, such as St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Anselm. These arguments are perhaps best left for another column. It's enough now to say that faith and belief is not just a subjective thing, but is rational and can be affirmed in our statement of faith. Not only are we able to know God, but he wants to be known.

Polytheism was the norm for most religions in the ancient world, and some belief systems in the modern day maintain a belief in more than one God. Often, these gods were in charge of cosmic and weather-based
