Every October in the Archdiocese of Chicago we participate in what is commonly known as the October Count.

We take a formal count of how many people arrive each Sunday for one of our five Masses. This information helps the archdiocese and it also helps us here in the parish. We have seen a slight uptick in Mass participation since last October. Our average weekend total for October 2024 is 860 people; up from 805 people last year.

We are grateful for the increase. However, it's important for us to remember that Holy Mass is not just about physical attendance. Holy Mass is where we participate, and we do so fully, actively, and consciously. Our hearts and minds are engaged in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We are not sitting back and watching a performance. The people of God are celebrants in this sacred liturgy as the priest presides in persona Christi capitis (in the Person of Christ).

It's common for the people of a parish and for archdiocese leaders to ask, "How many people are at Mass on Sunday?" Or they ask, "How much was the collection on Sunday?" These kinds of questions are to be expected. However, there is a deeper spiritual question that

also needs to be taking place at the universal, archdiocesan, and parish level.

The deeper spiritual question that needs to be ask is, "Are the people growing in holiness?" Or we can ask, "Are we becoming saints?"

We might initially pull back from such lofty aspirations, but we must remember that this is the reason the Church exists. The Church exists primarily for the salvation of souls and the sanctification of the people. Everything Christ gives us in and through His Church is for our good: Holy Mass, Sacred Scripture, the sacraments, prayer, the works of mercy.

These are all sacred "helps" to salvation and holiness. We ignore them to our own peril. And too many folks today ignore them for a variety of reasons: too busy, don't like the priest, don't like the bishop, don't like the pope, still angry about the child sex abuse crisis, too much talk about money, they feel unworthy or too far gone, Mass is boring, Mass is too long, lost faith after death of a loved one, the Church is too conservative, the Church is too liberal, someone gave them dirty look when their child cried during Mass, etc., etc.

We can take comfort knowing the good Lord is not going to ask to see our October Count on Judgment Day, nor will God ask to see our financial sheet. The Lord is not going to ask, "What parish did you belong to?" What will matter is that we belonged to the Son and that we lived in His love; that we believe in the good news of salvation, live in the good news of salvation, and

share the good news of salvation. And that we die in a state of grace.

Where do we receive this grace? In and through the Church given to us by Christ. We don't get it from Washington D.C. We don't get it from Springfield, Illinois. We don't get it from Hollywood, Madison Avenue or Silicon Valley. Grace and sanctification are the work of the Holy Spirit; the same Holy Spirit given to the Apostles on Pentecost; the same Holy Spirit that guides the Church in truth and love.

We live in an age when far too many people think they don't need to be saved from anything, as if sin, evil, and death are not a reality. We call Jesus a Savior for a reason, for he has eternally saved us from sin, evil, and death. He saves us from sin and FOR LOVE.

Jesus sums it up nicely in our gospel this Sunday: Love God. Love neighbor!

We remain on the phrase, "The Father almighty," and since we know more about the Father as the first person of the Trinity, we can go on to what we mean by calling him almighty. In its fullness, this term is meant to stand in for all the divine attributes of God.

We all have attributes as persons, both positive and negative, that allow us to use language to describe who we are. Of course, language is always limited. How do you really put into words the complexities of the human person? Think of all the times that you've had difficulty putting a feeling or experience into words that let another understand. It almost always falls short. This isn't a good or bad thing, but simply a reality. The irony of using words to describe this limitation is not lost on me.

If using language to describe human persons and personalities is imperfect, then how much more does it lack when it comes to describing God? Several theologians throughout the ages of the Church have discussed this very problem of analogy. Here, analogy is a term that describes something that is applied in a way that is partly similar and partly dissimilar to what the term itself signifies.

What does this mean? Let's use an example of goodness. We say that

God is good; in fact, he is goodness itself. We also say that human beings are good. There is a difference between God's goodness and ours, but we can understand God's goodness by knowing about and experiencing human goodness. They are linked, but not equivalent. We aren't capable of understanding fully what it means for God to be good and even if we came close, our language is not capable of describing it.

Our words do not represent or define God; they signify him. They give us a knowledge of God while respecting his incomprehensibility. St. Augustine famously said, "Si comprehendis, non est Deus," which means, "If you comprehend it, it's not God." Again, this doesn't mean God is unknowable or completely mysterious. Rather, it speaks of a deep and simple reality – God is God and we are not. Our God reveals himself to us and allows us to explain him as we are able.

When we say God is almighty, eternal, good, and loving, among other things, what we actual mean is he is the perfection of those things themselves. We hear in the first letter of John that God isn't just loving, but he is love itself. As his creatures, we participate in his perfection.

There are a number of traditional divine attributes: God is simple (not made up of parts), infinite, eternal, one, unchanging, free, self-sufficient, absolute, omnipresent (everywhere), omniscient (all-knowing), omnipotent (all-powerful), benevolent (all-good), just, holy, and faithful. These attributes don't make or define God, but they allow us to recognize and identify that this God exists and he is indeed God. There can only be one supreme person with these attributes; if another had them, then that person would be God. Even here,

I'm limited in the right word, because God is not a being or a person, but is existence itself.

We use the divine attributes to help us know who God is and thus come to love him more. A God with these attributes is worthy of worship and praise. If we don't properly identify who God really is, then we will get a lot of other things wrong, like discipleship, morality, and redemption. Our language of theology and the words of scripture are necessary in making God accessible to us as limited, sensing creatures with reason, will, and intellect.

It is humbling to realize that a God with these attributes, who is transcendent in every way, can also be close to us, imminent to the daily lives of his creatures. He loves, he chooses, he desires, and he knows us. He allows us to know him too, and to choose to love and honor him as best as we can. Declaring that God is almighty gives him the freedom to work in our lives and hearts, ordering our very existence according to his great plan.




