

should first and foremost lead us to give praise to God so that the whole Church can benefit. It should reflect the order and harmony of heaven.

Whenever we gather for Mass, we can expect to do at least some chanting and singing. Not only does it elevate the words we use with beauty, but it allows us to use our whole selves to worship. Singing at liturgies has a deep root in Scripture and ritual worship, for as St. Augustine says, "Singing is for one who loves." Music is in integral part of our worship, as the Missal emphasizes its essential nature: "Every care should be taken that singing by the ministers and the people not be absent in celebrations that occur on Sundays and on holy days of Obligation."

Every culture has a style and tradition of music that rightly finds its way into the worship of God and the celebration of Mass. In the Roman liturgy, which we celebrate at THM, Gregorian chant takes pride of place and has a rich history in the Roman Catholic Church. Of course, other styles are allowed and should be promoted, as long as they "correspond to the spirit of the liturgical action and that they foster the participation of all the faithful."

So, how do we choose liturgical music? Why would it be inappropriate to break out a Taylor Swift or Led Zeppelin tune during Mass? We remember the "mission statement" of each Mass: "May the Lord accept the sacrifice for the

Much of what we sing at Mass is derived from, or in some cases directly from, sacred scripture. We've discussed the Mass parts previously and where they come from. Since it's the word of God given by God, we know that its usage will certainly direct glory back to God. One of the options for the entrance and communion songs are called "antiphons", which are always taken from the Bible. Each set of antiphons is proper to the given liturgical day. For example, the communion antiphon for this Sunday is, "The bread that I will give, says the Lord, is my flesh for the life of the world," which is clearly connected to our currently reading of John 6. At THM, they are most commonly said at daily Masses, but they also can be heard occasionally on Sundays.

Hymns are the other option and what most American Catholics are accustomed to. They gained popularity in the early 20th century as a way for the laity to participate in Mass using the vernacular language. However, there are plenty of hymns written throughout the history of the Church that are still used today, such as the Pange Lingua written by St. Thomas Aguinas. Hymns can be chosen based on the readings of the day or the liturgical season. These hymns should always lead us to give glory to God and should foster full participation by the entire congregation.

The preferred musical instrument is the human voice. It was given to us

by God and is the only instrument that will be present in the heavenly liturgy. It combines the breath (the Holy Spirit) and the word (Jesus). After the voice, the organ is the favored instrument in churches because of all the musical instruments, it most closely resembles the human voice. It passes air through a pipe to create a sound, much like the throat, instead of striking or plucking a string to produce notes. Of course, certain cultures can make good use of a variety of instruments that, when played well, encourage due praise of God.

Music can become a source of disagreement or annoyance in any church, especially since we all have our preferences and favorites. Every choir director must contend with the cultural and generational divides that are present on Sundays. This is why we must always keep in mind the criteria the Church lays out for liturgical music. There are some beautiful songs that are best suited for praise and worship during adoration, others for communal prayers like the Liturgy of the Hours. The emphasis on Mass should be music that glorifies God, not ourselves, edifies the faithful, and can be sung in unison as the Body of Christ.




