

We live now in a security camera world.

There aren't too many places you can go today that aren't being monitored by some kind of camera, or drone, or eye in the sky. Perhaps it's a sign of the times that we need this kind of "security" to deter crime. Whether it's working or not is up for debate.

Even here in the parish and our school, we have security cameras. We occasionally have an incident take place on or near our properties and the cameras help us and the Chicago Police Department.

I've been formulating a theory lately that suggests the more we dismiss God and deny God – and the more we ignore or deny that there will be an accounting to God for how we have lived our life – the more we need man-made monitoring to "keep people in check."

This is supposed to be the role of our conscience. Conscience helps us hear the voice of God; it helps us recognize the truth about God and the truth about how we ought to live. Conscience is a judgment of reason by which we determine whether an action is right or wrong.

We must admit, at this point, that a person's conscience can be properly formed, or one's conscience can be ill-formed. One's conscience should be formed in God's love and God's law. A properly formed conscience helps us do the right thing and steer clear of doing the wrong thing.

Our second reading this Sunday from Hebrews tells us, "No creature is concealed from him (God), but everything is naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must render an account."

This should wake us up, but there are far too many folks who scoff at the reality of God and who scoff at the revealed truth from sacred scripture that there will be an accounting of our life to the One who is Love.

Please don't read this as God using a magnifying glass to closely see you cheating on your diet or helping yourself to couple "free" olives from the plastic tray on the bar that's supposed to be for martinis.

The reality is there are people today choosing to plot and carry out evil; both at the international level, the national level, and the local level. This evil can take many forms. We're quick to point to the criminals on our streets wearing gang colors, but sometimes gangsters and criminals wear fancy suits and ties.

They don't hang out on the street corner but in corner offices of large corporate or governmental buildings making decisions that harm – directly or indirectly – our humanity.

There is a subtle scene in the movie Godfather III when young Vincent Corleone (Sonny's son) is introduced to Don Lucchesi. The two of them share a brief exchange. Vincent admits he is more of an enforcer (use of guns) than a finance guy. Lucchesi is a finance guy. He knows how to work numbers.

This leads Don Lucchesi to say to Vincent, "Finance is like a gun. Politics is knowing when to pull the trigger."

Lesson? Money can be used as a weapon.

When we allow God's love and God's law to penetrate our minds and hearts, we are also forming a healthy conscience that seeks to love God and love neighbor. When God is denied, ignored, or rejected, then we open ourselves to dark forces that are less than loving; our minds and hearts grow dark as does our conscience.

Sadly, there are too many folks in our world who are counting on there being no God and no accounting to God; many of them hold positions of great power and they make decisions that affect millions

and billions of human beings. Who or what forms their conscience? Good question.

May our consciences be formed not by cameras (or worse), but by a loving God who gives us the Holy Spirit and the gifts of the Holy Spirit to guide us along the way of love shown to us in the Person of Jesus, the Christ; the One who is the way, and the truth, and the life.

St. John of the Cross wrote, "In the twilight of life, God will not judge us on our earthly possessions and human success, but rather on how much we have loved."

Watch Out for Scams

A trend in crime in recent years comes from people who use a priest's name (which they often take from a parish website) to scam people out of money or introduce a virus into your computer or phone.

Just last week, one of our parishioners came to me saying she received a text message on her phone from me asking her to click on a link to help me out. This was a scam. A few years ago, the teachers at our parish school received an email from me that was bogus.

Please, please, please be careful of these scams. Fr. Kevin and I would NEVER reach out to you this way, nor would our principal, Dr. Berry. These scams come from people with sick hearts. They want to use a priest's name (whom you trust) to take advantage of your trust.

Some of these scams originate within the United States, and some of them come from other countries far from the southwest side of Chicago.

If you ever are in doubt about a message from Fr. Kevin or I, please call the parish office and ask questions. We will clarify it ASAP.

FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

Throughout this time, the Apostle's Creed was being used for those being baptized. If you've been to a baptism, you'll remember that the catechumen (person to be baptized) or the parents answer questions about Catholic belief by saying "I do". These questions are based upon the creed written in the second century that affirmed personal belief. As the common language of the Church moved from Greek to Latin, there was a shift in what the inclusion of the creed at Mass signified.

With Church doctrine more defined and widely understood, it was no longer as necessary to stress unified belief. Instead, believers saw more that attending Mass was an extension and expression of the faith entered into at baptism, in which "I believe" is stated. So, the Creed was added to the Mass as a verbal expression of this understanding. Saying in unison, "I believe" affirmed that there is a personal aspect of faith in relationship with Christ, that we all have the same foundation that we agree on, and that acknowledge that this unity in diversity.

We use the word "believe", and not "know", "understand", or "think". This does not mean that the statements of the creed are irrational or superstitious. Our culture loves to say that science is the only way to know something. It's accurate that science is good and effective in fulfilling its purpose. However, many truths are beyond the ability of the scientific method to examine or

determine. Our use of believe is the same as the original Greek (pisteuo) and Latin (credere), which points to being worthy of trust and commitment.


Faith is foremost a gift from God given to us at baptism, one that helps us know who he is and grow in trust of his presence and will in our lives. Even when it comes to truths that are hard to understand, we are able to give our unreserved, unconditional acceptance because we know their source – God.

Belief is always a free choice, so forced belief is not true belief. Rather, we choose to take a leap because we trust the voice of the one calling out to us. As the Catechism says, "Faith is man's response to God, who reveals himself and gives himself to man, at the same time bringing man a superabundant light as he searches for the ultimate meaning of his life." [CCC 26] The creed helps that belief by succinctly laying out those revealed truths so that we can more fully trust in God and more genuinely respond to him.

In examining the first two major Church councils, we can get an idea of the struggles and questions the followers of Jesus were wrestling with. At its heart, they were asking the question, "Who is Jesus?" Who is Jesus in context of Jewish history? Who is Jesus in relation to God the Father? Who is Jesus in broader history of human salvation? These questions are important, because knowing who Jesus is determines how his followers should live. Believers had experienced and come to profess, either through eyewitness or some other encounter, that Jesus was Lord and Savior. Now, they had a more defined declaration of who Jesus is and what he did for creation.

With its proper context in mind, we'll dive into the text of the Nicene-Constantinopolitan creed. From the start, we can find where we get the term "creed" in the first place. In Latin, this statement of belief starts with "Credo", which means "I believe".

You may remember that when the translation of the Mass was updated in 2011, we switched from "We believe" to "I believe". This was no arbitrary change, and there are good reasons for each. The original creed, written in Greek, used the first-person plural "we". It was important for the council fathers to present a
