Perhaps you, too, can recall someone being picked on in grade school because they got good grades, did the right thing, and was the teacher's pet.

The child would receive unwarranted verbal abuse for being a good person.

We'd like to think we mature beyond childhood bullying, but our readings this Sunday remind us that unwarranted bullying can move with us into adulthood on the part of those who dish out the bullying and those on the receiving end.

"The wicked say, 'Let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us. He sets himself against our doings, reproaches us for transgressions of the law and charges us with violations of our training."

The reading from Wisdom continues.

"Let us condemn him to a shameful death; for according to his own words. God will take care of him."

In this Old Testament reading, we can see how it points to (foreshadows) what will happen one day to the Son of God and Son of man in the Person of Jesus, the Christ. The incarnate God walks among the people teaching, healing, and driving out demons. He is met with resistance from the religious leaders of the time who decide something needs to be done with the carpenter from Nazareth. They scheme to get Jesus

arrested, call him a blasphemer, and get the Roman authorities to do their dirty work (putting Jesus to death). The One who is Love (Jesus) tells his disciples in today's Gospel, "The Son of man is to handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of man will rise."

Jesus points to his Paschal Mystery; his suffering, death, resurrection and ascension. In this act is our salvation. God can bring about an amazing good from what seemed to be wickedness. He dies our death so that we might now have life in Him; a life of grace.

Sadly, not everyone wants this life of grace; not everyone wants the Savior sent for our salvation, and the Holy Spirit for our sanctification. There are those today who choose the way of wickedness. There are those today who scheme and plot wicked things; those who mock goodness, virtue, and sanctity all the while fomenting vice and division among the people; flexing their insecure muscles trying to be the greatest and rule the world; seemingly forgetting or not caring that one day they must render an account to God.

Jesus, in our Gospel this Sunday, counters the pride of his Apostles by placing a child in their midst. He's basically saying, "Get over yourselves." We know now, however, that after Pentecost, after the Apostles received the fullness of the Holy Spirit, they humbled themselves and boldly went into the world to proclaim the good news of salvation; to the point that ten of them were killed and the other (John) imprisoned because of the Holy Name of Jesus.

We, as Christians, find our strength and courage in the Lord. Being a disciple of Christ brings joy and peace of soul that remains even when suffering emerges, and our cross gets heavy.

Let's face it, my friends, it's tough to comprehend the wickedness that exists in this world. Our readings today remind us that it's nothing new. Wickedness is not a modern thing. It's as old as the slithering serpent in the Garden of Eden. We should not be surprised when -- as God is pushed away -- something less than loving fills the void.

What are we to do? Live our faith. Pray daily. Live a sacramental life. If you need to go to Confession, then go to Confession. Get right with God. Participate every Sunday in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Receive the Eucharist. Spend time reading and pondering Sacred Scripture. Put into action the corporeal and spiritual works of mercy. Stay humble. Keep a childlike simplicity.

Live each day of your life with an eternal perspective. Bring the light of Christ wherever you go. Call upon the Holy Spirit often, and as Pope Leo the Great wrote, "Christian, remember your dignity."

Will we be mocked? Hated? Possibly! But so was Jesus, He who is risen. Alleluia!

As we've covered the various aspects, items, and moments of the Mass over these last several months, we've hopefully come to see why "The celebration of Mass ... is the center of the whole of Christian life for the Church both universal and local, as well as for each of the faithful individually." Objectively, it is the most important thing we will do all week. I don't just say that as a priest, but as a fellow Catholic who sees just how important it is to worship God in union with Jesus Christ and my

Fr. Bob and I don't give priority to the Sunday liturgies because it's our job, but rather because we've been called by God to act in the person of Jesus to lead all THM parishioners in the work of saving souls and glorifying the name of the Lord. It is a privilege to do so, and neither of us lets a moment at Mass pass by that we aren't in awe of what we get to do. Phoning it in is not an option.

Mass isn't always about what we take away from it or how we feel during or after. However, if I had a few recommendations to make in order to "improve" your Sunday experience, I would say:

- Read the readings for the week, especially the Gospel. You can even come up with your own homily and "compare notes" with what the priest provides
- Sing the hymns and Mass parts and speak aloud the responses of the faithful
- Follow along the words of the Mass in the missals provided in the pews
- Come to each Mass with a specific intention, aspect of gratitude, or suffering to offer to the Lord along with the bread and wine
- Make a prayer of thanksgiving after receiving communion, closing your eyes and not letting yourself be distracted by what is happening around you

 Reflect after Mass about one thing new or unique that struck you in the Mass, whether in the prayers, the readings, the homily, or the Eucharistic offering

Of course, I know that with busy schedules, work, and kids running around, it can be difficult to put a priority on preparing for and fully participating at Mass in the way we want to. As in all things on the road of holiness, it's about striving and seeing ourselves move toward the Lord, with the Lord.

I hope that this dive into the Mass has been fruitful and helpful in your approach to coming to Mass. We can love something better when we come to know it better. Certainly, many parts of liturgy will remain a mystery that cannot be described or fully explained. They can only be experienced. That's why we don't read books and guides about the Mass to you on Sundays. We come together and celebrate the Mass actively, learning and worshipping by doing. It may not always be perfect, but we can always be assured that it is united to Christ and the great redemptive work of his Passion, Resurrection, and Ascension.


