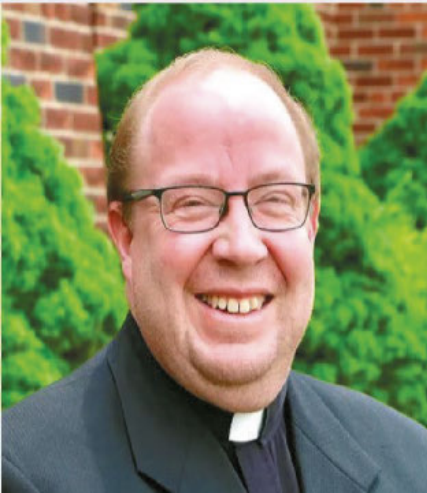

FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG

Our responsorial psalm this Sunday is worth highlighting.

We sing, "Blessed are they who hope in the Lord." This psalm directs our hope toward the One who can ultimately satisfy the longing in our heart. Hope is not wishful thinking.

"Hope is the confident expectation of divine blessing and the beatific vision of God." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2090).

To have hope is to go about our lives with confidence in God, even when we experience the sufferings that are part of life in this world. Jesus gives us assuring words when he says, "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." (John 16:33).

We, as human beings, must have hope. There is great danger when we lose hope, and yet we realize how easy it is for folks to lose hope. People let us down. Our trials and tribulations risk becoming too much to bear. We think the world should be one way and it turns out some other way. We might cry out, "Where is God in all this?" Is Jesus asleep in the boat? Does he not care that we might sink?

The events of Good Friday seemed to be good reason for the first followers of Jesus to lose hope. The guy they thought was the long-awaited Messiah is arrested, mocked, beaten,

whipped, spat upon, and crucified. He dies upon a cross. Hope lost? Nope! Just days later, the most significant event in human history takes place; the resurrection of Christ. Our redemption is at hand. Love is stronger than death, and Love is who went to the cross to eternally conquer sin, evil, and death, but the crucifixion means nothing without the truth of the resurrection.

This is the point St. Paul is trying to get across in our second reading from 1 Corinthians. The entirety of our faith rests upon the truth of the bodily resurrection of Jesus from the dead. It either happened or it did not happen. St. Paul writes, "If the dead are not raised, neither has Christ been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins."

Christ is risen. He is the reason for our HOPE. Bodily death carries no sting because death is not the victor. There is a reason we call this GOOD NEWS. Our soul is immortal. The promise of Christ is that if we share his cross, we shall also share in his resurrection. Our immortal soul will be joined to a glorified body when Christ makes all things new.

This truth should excite us, inspire us, and guide us.

Sadly, there are far too many people who remain either indifferent to Christ or have chosen to reject him. Everyone has their reasons, but we do not stop sharing this good news with those who cross our path.

Having the theological virtue of hope changes how we see things. We need not despair every time there is a natural disaster, a school shooting, or a cancer diagnosis. In time of crisis, we respond with love. In faith, we carry the cross all the while trusting in

the Lord. Romans 8:28 reminds us, "We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." My dear friends, stay close to Christ. Pray. Participate every Sunday in Holy Mass. Receive the Eucharist. Make regular use of the sacrament of reconciliation. Live out the works of mercy. Learn more about our beautiful faith by using Formed.org. Grow in discipleship.

Keep at bay the despair and anxiety being fomented by a godless dehumanizing culture. Be a discerning consumer, which means carefully choosing what you read, what you watch, what you listen to on a regular basis. Gaze lovingly upon the Lord first and allow everything else to flow from this primary love. Nurture an attitude of gratitude, even for the little things in life.

Blessed are they who hope in the Lord.

FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

There are four main historical aspects that must be contested in order to say the Resurrection was a myth or a lie. The first is that Jesus died and was buried in the first place. All four gospels give details about this burial, along with including members of the Sanhedrin, Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea. Additionally, the Romans were experts in execution; there wasn't some scenario in which they buried a "nearly-dead" Jesus.

The hope with which the Early Christians lived because of the Resurrection and eternal life was a testament to how firmly this belief was held. Resurrection was not merely bringing a person back to life, but a transformation into a new way of being. Humanity persisted, but was elevated to that of the promised new heaven and new earth. It wasn't some vision or illusion of Jesus' spirit, but his actual resurrected body that came to the apostles.

The Passion of Jesus Christ via crucifixion is a central aspect of our faith. A crucifix can be found in every church and on every set of rosary beads. Of course, we wouldn't be celebrating the cross without what came next – the Resurrection. As we hear in the second reading this week from St. Paul: "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins."

There will always be those who wish to discredit the fact of the Resurrection and write it off as some vast 2,000-year-old conspiracy. What they miss is that the event of the Resurrection is far better attested to than many of the historical events we take as fact. In the end, these doubts are usually engaged with as a way to avoid followed the demanding, yet life-giving, tenets of Christianity.

We are proud to profess that while yes, Jesus suffered death and was buried, "he rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures." The Resurrection is the turning point of our faith, the moment when everything clicked into place. The Son of God came to earth in human form in order to conquer sin and death and bring his people to eternal life. The cross demonstrated love and obedience, and rising from the dead demonstrated power over what was once thought insurmountable.

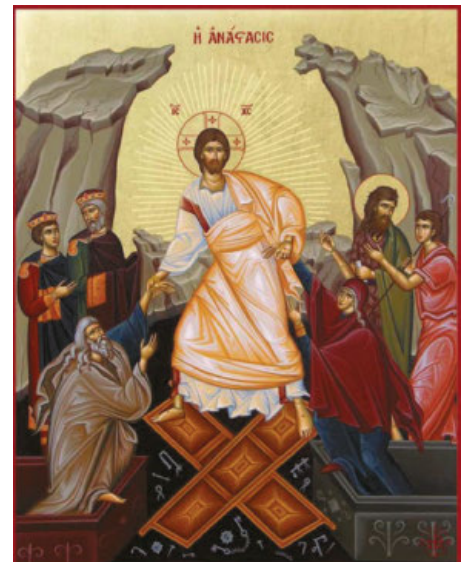
The second is the discovery of the empty tomb, first by some of the women who followed Jesus, then by his disciples. The inclusion of the women's testimony is noteworthy, as a group that was fabricating a story wouldn't have rested it on the word of women. You'll remember that in those days, the word of a woman was never used in court testimony. They would not have made Mary Magdalene the "Apostle to the apostles".

Jesus spoke time and again to his followers about his impending mission and that after dying, he would rise on the third day. The fact that he did in fact rise acts as a confirmation of everything he did and taught. The Resurrection wasn't just a happy ending to a nice story, but is the essential piece in the history of salvation.

The event of the Resurrection has been a point of debate over the years. Did it really happen? What if the disciples just said he was raised while they hid his body? Was it all just an excuse to start some new religion? Did they just want to maintain the good vibes and wholesome teachings of Jesus in some act of remembrance?

The third is the word of those who Jesus appeared to after the Resurrection. There are numerous accounts of Christ coming to visit the disciples and other followers with his resurrected body. The consistency and variety of the accounts helps to discount the rumors of some mass hallucination.

Finally, we have the Acts of the Apostles and the convictions of the early Church. The disciples professed with deep belief that Jesus had not only been crucified, but had been raised just as he had said he would. Both Peter and Paul give lengthy sermons on the events of the Old Testament and how the passion and resurrection fulfilled those promises made to God's people. Apart from St. John, all these apostles were martyred for their belief and affirmation that the Resurrection of the Son of God truly occurred.
