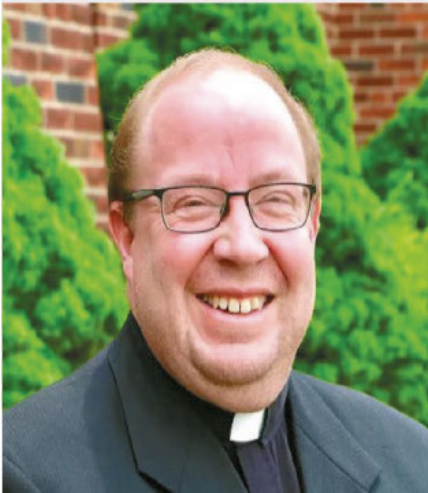

informed citizens. We need to be informed about important matters. What we can do is balance the news of the day with the Good News, which is the Gospel of our Lord, Jesus Christ. We live with a newspaper in one hand and the Holy Bible in the other. We hold in tension this world and eternal life.

Mary, the Blessed Mother, serves as a model for us in times of trouble. In our gospel this Sunday, the Wedding at Cana, the hosts ran out of wine. This would have been a huge embarrassment for the family. Mary intervenes and turns to Jesus. She instructs the servers by saying, "Do whatever he tells you." These are Mary's last recorded words in sacred scripture. She points to her Son and says, "Do whatever he tells you."

This is wonderful advice from our spiritual mother. Her role is always to direct us to the One who is able to change water into wine. She models for us humility and trust, even during times when it might seem as if all hell has broken loose.

It's not a coincidence that Jesus' first miracle took place during a humble wedding. For he is the Bridegroom who has come to wed heaven and earth; divinity and humanity. He is the Mediator, and he desires to marry our hearts to his Sacred Heart.

Divine love will not force itself. Love makes the offer and waits for our response; waits for our "I do."

What is our response to Love? Can we confidently say, "I do," or are do we hesitate with, "Um, not yet."

The One who changes water into wine desires to change our minds and hearts, and the good Lord does this with the power of the Gospel and the truth of the Paschal Mystery. The word Gospel means good news or glad tidings. The good news of Jesus reminds us that Love is stronger than death, and that Love went to the cross to eternally conquer sin, evil, and death. Yes, this is the Gospel truth we're invited to keep in mind amidst the bad news that comes our way in this world. Knowing this, we can maintain a healthy balance that nurtures hope when dark forces tempt us toward despair.

Our hope is not in a what, but a Who. Who is our hope? Christ. Let's do what he tells us.

One of the challenges in our current culture is the 24/7 news cycle.

Unless we intentionally unplug and distance ourselves from the TV, radio, computer, or smart phone, the "news" is coming at us all day long. News we need. News we don't need. We live in an age of information overload and saturation.

The prolonged overconsumption of news and media can rattle our soul and steal our peace. We are bombarded with "News Alert," and "Breaking Story." Day after day, week after week, month after month, and this begins to wear us down. This agitates our soul.

We find ourselves despairing of the world we live in and losing hope. The people in the news ratings game are seldom concerned with the wellness of your soul and your spiritual life. The primary concern of the "news" business today is ratings and revenue. It's about clicks and getting more eyeballs on a story for advertising reasons, and less about getting the truth of a story to the people.

We certainly cannot check out as



# FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

We've come to one of the key words in the Nicene Creed, one towards which we have been building in our examination of the relationship between the Father and the Son. Remember, the Arians argued that Son was not divine, or at least not fully divine, and was created by the Father. The Council Fathers fought this with phrases like "only-begotten" and "God from God". In order to hammer home the equal divinity of the Father and the Son, they turned to the world of Greek philosophy to explain the relationship.

They used the Greek term "*homoousios*", which we translate in English as consubstantial. It's a fancy word, but it has deep meaning. It means "one in being" or "of the same substance". To understand this, we'll need to dive briefly into metaphysics, which dates back to the time of Plato and Aristotle and looks into the truths beyond the material world.

The substance of a thing is its truest essence, the fundamental core of a thing. It is anything that exists in and of itself. If you change the substance, it becomes something else entirely. This is opposed to an object's accidents, or the properties of an object. These are categories like size, color,

quality, location, or action. A t-shirt is a t-shirt; its substance is t-shirtness. If I dye it a new color, or place it in the washing machine, or apply a logo, it still remains a t-shirt. Something like color can't exist without a substance to apply it to. However, two t-shirts next to each other have different substances; this t-shirt is not that t-shirt, although they are united in having the nature of a t-shirt.

So, when we say something has the same substance as another, they share the same central nature and essence. The Son has the same substance as the Father, which is supreme divinity. Both are co-equal and co-eternal.

The inclusion of *homoousios* was novel for the Council of Nicaea. It had not been a term previously attributed to Trinity, which had primarily been described by Biblical language. It wasn't customary to use philosophical terms, but it was not completely out of the question. Members of the early Church, including St. Paul, would have been exposed to Greek philosophy and many of them used it in developing their theology. It was included because of the clarity of the term in the effort to rule out any suggestion that the Son was created from nothing.

Many have and continue to object to the use of philosophy and reason in religious discourse. The theologian Tertullian famously said, "What has Athens to do with Jerusalem?" He objected to using secular and non-religious terms and ideas to explain theological concepts. However, the majority of

the Church Fathers understood that truth is truth. If a philosophical term or notion explained some known truth, then it was from God because he is truth itself.

Theologians throughout the ages have continued to use philosophy and other fields, such as science and art, to bring clarity to understanding the mysteries of God. As we've discussed, it will always remain analogous because our language can never properly describe the fullness of divinity. While we remain based in scripture and revelation, Christians are able to borrow terms that help explain what we know to be true about God. There is no need to be afraid on non-religious terms and ideas; we can be open to adopt terms like the Council Fathers did.

The later councils helped to further clarify the full extent of what *homoousios* entailed but the concerns that it wasn't scriptural did not last long. It provided a major step in explaining the mystery of the Trinity in which three divine persons share one substance and essence as God. The key is to avoid the Trinitarian heresies, which we'll cover next time.

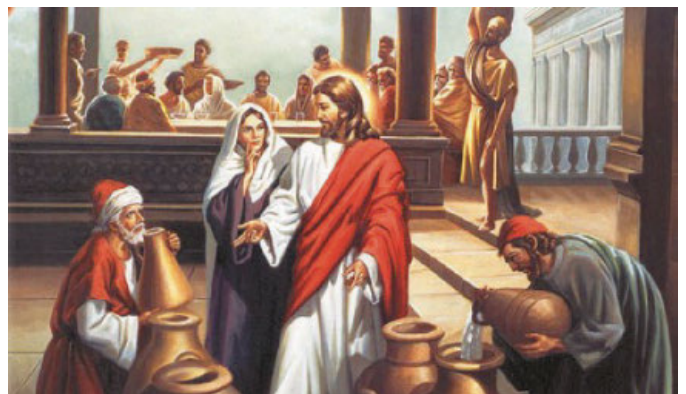

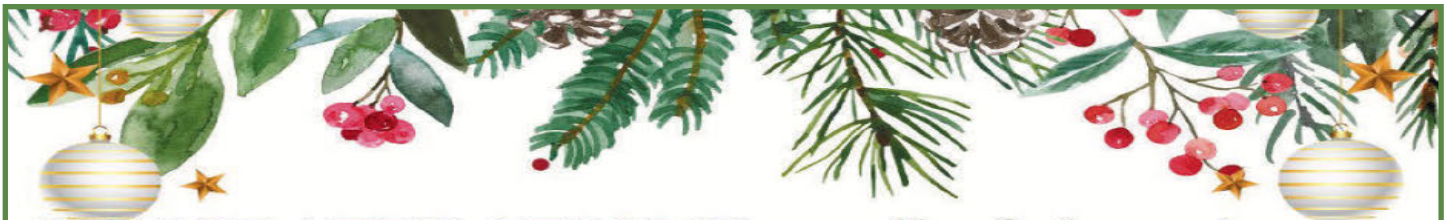
