



Back in my early teens, my brother Glenn invited me to sit down and watch the movie *It's A Wonderful Life*. I lasted about ten minutes. The movie was in black and white and the opening scene between God, Joseph, and Clarence seemed ridiculous.

A couple years later, however, I gave the movie another chance and It's a Wonderful Life has remained in my Top 5 ever since. The closing scene always makes my eyes water.

The main character is George Bailey, played by Jimmy Stewart. George was a talented young man who had dreams and visions of going out into the world to do big things. Life's circumstances, however, led to George having to let go of what he wanted and to sacrifice for what others needed.

The viewer can sense the inner tension in George as situation after situation pops up and gets in the way of his own dreams. He struggles and the tension boils to the point it affects his wife, children, coworkers, and friends. In a despairing moment, he considers taking his life by jumping off a bridge into an icy river.

Writer Frank Capra crafted a scenario where an angel is sent to help George see things differently. It works, and George changes his mind about taking his life after having a change of heart; a conversion, if you will.

At one point in the movie, as George stands in his office, there is a picture of his now deceased father, Peter, on the wall with a message underneath the picture. The message reads, "All you

can take with you is that which you've given away."

We're being reminded that our material stuff doesn't go with us when we die; not houses, not cars, not golf clubs, not boats, not coin collections, not 401Ks. What goes with us is love, or the lack thereof.

Advent and Christmas invite us to remember God's plan of salvation. We have a Savior who has eternally conquered sin, evil, and death. This truth helps us maintain an eternal perspective while we live in this world. We live not just for ourselves but for the greater glory of God. We love God and we love neighbor, as Christ commands.

One of the names we use for Jesus is Emmanuelle, which means God with us. The Nativity of our Lord changed the world. There is a reason we use B.C. and A.D. when we date history. Christ is the center of human history. Amidst the world's despair, there is hope, because Christ has overcome the world.

Christmas is not about magic and warm fuzzies. Christmas is about God taking on human flesh (Incarnation) as part of the plan of salvation to restore relationship between heaven and earth; between divinity and humanity. Although not magic, it is a great mystery.

We look back in time, yes, but we also look at how Christ is present to us now, and how the Lord will come again in the future with power and glory when all is brought to fulfillment. We should avoid the temptation to only look back on our lives and forget to look forward; not in doom and gloom but with faith, hope, and love.

The words of St. John of the Cross wake us up. He wrote, "In the twilight of life, God will not judge us on our earthly possessions and human success, but rather on how much we have loved."

Jesus is the WHY of our joy and hope. Our love is not abstract. It's personal because God is personal; a divine relationship of love that is God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit. We want to see faith as more than a cold theory and more as a relationship. We want to view our participation in Holy Mass not as a courtroom but as a classroom where the Lord teaches us and sanctifies us for the mission of proclaiming the good news of salvation.


The story of George Baily in *It's a Wonderful Life* can help us regain perspective so that we live with God in mind, with the good of others in mind, and with the promise of eternal life in our hearts.

The "WHY" of Christmas is Love, and God is Love.

Merry Christmas to you and your loved ones. May the Lord's blessings be upon you and may we each be more intentional in our faith in the coming year. The marching orders are from the Lord Himself. "Go, make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (MT 28).

With Christmas approaching, I'm going to take a short break from our deep dive into the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed. As you have guessed by now, I am a big movie fan. I've probably used film references in 25% of my homilies, and there are surely more to come. Christmas always comes with its own set of movies (and no, Die Hard is not a Christmas movie – feel free to defend it in the narthex after a Mass).

I also love rankings and lists. A friend asked at the beginning of Advent for my top five holiday movies are, and I figured that I should share them with all of you:

- 1. A Charlie Brown Christmas
- 2. A Muppets' Christmas Carol
- 3. Elf
- 4. It's a Wonderful Life
- 5. The Santa Clause

There is just something about a movie about the magic of Christmas that hits us in the right way. Perhaps it's the memories of growing up watching them with family. Perhaps is that they always are uplifting. Perhaps is because they show us a happier world that could be. Or perhaps it's the bright colors and catchy tunes.

Whatever it is, a good Christmas movie helps us to remember that there is something bigger than ourselves. Even a secular holiday flick has the characters believing in something that is transcendent and grand. We are all drawn to the spark of the divine and to that which gives us life.

At Christmas, we as Christians recognize that this transcendent existence that is the source of all come to intimately dwell within humanity. The verse from St. John's gospel prologue might be the most power phrase ever uttered in human history: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory." No other people has a God who comes so close as ours.

I think often of those Christmas movie moments that speak so clearly of Christ's centrality in our lives. It's in Linus' recitation of Luke's nativity account when Charlie Brown wants to know what Christmas is all about. It's in Harry Bailey toast, "To my big brother, George, the richest man in town," when the latter rediscovered the importance of his existence in the face of grumpy Mr. Potter. It's in Buddy the Elf remaining a bright light for those who have fallen into isolation and materialism.

Hopefully you've gotten a chance to rewatch your favorites during this December. If not, you still have plenty of time – the Christmas season lasts all the way until the Baptism of the Lord on

January 12th. Maybe they aren't explicitly about the "reason for the season", but sometimes those are the ones that touch us most deeply.

The Incarnation is real both as an event that happened 2,000 years ago and one that extends through time in the reality of the Church. We are reminded again and again that our Lord comes to us in what is true, good, and beautiful. The sacraments are the fullest way, with the Eucharist at the pinnacle, but do not exhaust all the ways the Lord is present to us and draws us to be like him. Him coming in the flesh didn't push the material world down further, but instead elevated it so that it could be the way of encountering him.

I will continue to tune in to my favorite Christmas movies not just because they bring good feelings, but because they are small instances of the Lord guiding me into the good, the true, and the beautiful. That's what Christmas is all about, Charlie Brown.


