FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG

Our second reading this Sunday offers a truth that makes us squirm a bit.

“For we all must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.” (2 Cor 5: 10).

Try proclaiming this scripture verse in the public square today. Any mention of final judgment is considered crazy talk by plenty of folks. However, if we dismiss the notion of final judgment then we must also call into question sacred scripture itself, and plenty of folks today are certainly calling into question the credibility of sacred scripture.

The Church reveres the canon of sacred scripture. We consider it God's word; inspired by the Holy Spirit using human beings as instruments to write the story of salvation.

The truth of final judgment is meant to wake us up to how we are living our lives. This is what makes conversion stories so beautiful. Someone was living a wayward life.

They couldn't care less about God and the things of God. They lived selfishly and, perhaps, cooperated in doing great evil. One day, however, grace seems to break through. They see the error of their ways and they have a change of heart; a change of mind.

Although still an imperfect human being with quirks and faults, this person now desires to live for the greater glory of God. They repent of their past and make a choice to move forward as a disciple of Jesus, the Christ.

You and I are also imperfect. We, too, have our quirks and faults. Our lives, however, are Christ centered. This keeps us from going “off the rails.”

We might still steal an item from Walgreen's. We might tell some white lies. We might gossip. We might still excuse ourselves from Holy Mass on occasion. We might struggle in our marriages or help ourselves to supplies from the workplace storage room.

But we're not orchestrating genocide.

We're not manipulating economic systems to intentionally harm people.

We're not inventing weapons of mass destruction to be used on other human beings. We're not putting a certain group of people into train boxcars and transporting them to death camps.

We're not masterminding some Ponzi scheme to steal millions of dollars from people's retirement accounts.

We're not involved in the international sex trafficking of minors.

Sadly, there are folks who scoff at the notion of God. They dismiss all moral teaching. They flaunt the notion of any final judgment, and they decide to live however they choose to live and will not accept responsibility for the consequences. They do not realize they will reap in eternity what they have sowed in this life. This will have been their choice.

This life on earth is our time of choosing. We make choices every single day. Life is choices, and the ultimate choice is to live for God with words and actions that match. There are plenty of people who have done horrific things in the name of God. We need look no further than what took place within our own institutional Church; the sexual abuse of minors. Those actions were NOT OF GOD. The extreme cases of child sexual abuse were not about human weakness. Something more nefarious was at hand.

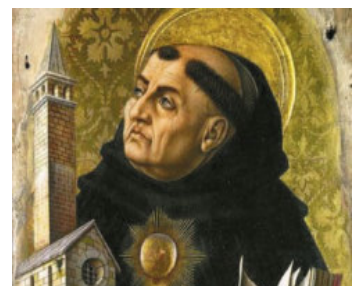
Even today, throughout the world, evil acts are done in the name of God because it's not even about God. It's about the warped human desire to rule the world and amass more and more land and resources, and to oppress another group of people. Yes, even self-professed Christians can do awful things all the while wearing a cross around their neck or saying, “Lord, Lord,” as they cooperate with evil.

Jesus wants us to wake up and wake up NOW! In our Gospel this Sunday, Jesus talks about the Kingdom of God.

This kingdom is growing even now as you and I breathe, but one day, “when the grape is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come. (Mark 4: 26-34).

Mary, mother of mercy, pray for us.

FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

The bread has been taken up, blessed and offered in thanksgiving, and broken for distribution. Now, the Body of Christ must be given to complete the sacrifice in the reception of communion. To initiate this, the priest shows the broken host along with the chalice to the faithful and says: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world."

Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."

Jesus has been called the Lamb of God since the beginning of his ministry. It was John the Baptist who first pointed out Jesus as the Lamb of God who has come to take away sins. From that moment, the disciples begin to recognize the one the need to follow, one who comes as a humble lamb meant to be sacrificed. This is a clear connection to the Passover Lamb that was sacrificed and that led to the freedom of the Israelite from Egypt.

We are asked to behold Jesus present in the Eucharist. This is more than just looking or observing. At that moment, we recognize who is being given to us

in the form of bread and wine. We can also recall the words of Pontius Pilate when he brings Jesus out to the people after he was scourged and crowned with thorns: "Ecce, homo! Behold, the man!" Little did Pilate know that he was prefiguring the Mass in calling the people to ponder the one who shows perfect obedience and see the victory perfect love can win.

As believers, we are truly blessed to be called to partake in this mystical meal and receive from the Lord the very means of our salvation. So, we respond to the elevated host, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." (Matt 8:8) These words are borrowed from the centurion who comes to Jesus and asks that his servant be healed while acknowledging that he doesn't deserve such a blessing. It's a true understanding of the initiative on behalf of God and his desire to bring his people back into communion.

It is because of our unworthiness that we are invited by the Lord to receive from his heavenly banquet.

If we were perfect, we wouldn't truly need the gift of the Eucharist, and we certainly wouldn't be grateful for it. Our admission of unworthiness is not some exercise in self-pity, massive guilt, or a lack of self-esteem. We aren't called to stay in a state of unworthiness, but we are healed by this gift.

The supreme God and creator desires that we share in the love that is exchanged between the

Father and the Son. Who are we to deny that invitation?

You may remember that the words "enter under my roof" was a new translation in 2011, changed from "receive you". It's a more faithful translation of the original Latin since it truly evokes the image of us being temples of the Holy Spirit. We have these spaces, given to us by God and created for his dwelling, to offer to the Lord. Often, we fill these spaces with things of the world. Confession and communion are meant to free up those spaces so that Jesus really can enter in and transform the space to our greatest benefit.

We can also give thanks that Jesus has called us to be his friends.

While the centurion asks for his servant to be healed by Christ, we know that we are more than servants of God. Yes, we are creatures of God and because we do things for him in his name, our dignity as Christians brings us to something higher. It is by the healing of our souls and spirits by the Body and Blood of Christ that we come to see that dignity within ourselves, ones who are worthy of being saved. God's goodness to men cannot be matched, but simply received and passed on.

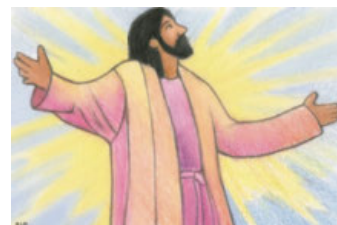

*The Registration Form is available on our Parish Website. You may also register at the Main Parish Office. We will continue to offer Faith Formation sessions for grades 1- 8.

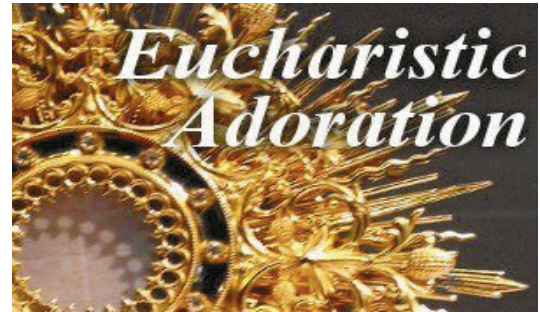

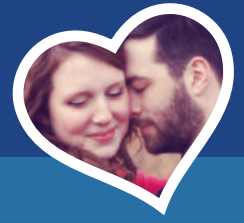
